

TCI Global Conference 2013, "Designing the future. Innovation through strategic partnerships", Kolding, Denmark, 3-6 September 2013

<u>300 participants from 40 countries attend the main international conference on cluster development in the world, organized annually by the TCI Network.</u>

The conference is organised in collaboration between The Region of Southern Denmark, REG X - The Danish Cluster Academy, the University of Southern Denmark, The Triangle Region Denmark, The Danish German Growth Region Project and the Municipality of Kolding.

In the Region of Southern Denmark, clusters are part of the DNA. With a focused regional cluster strategy, the region aims at setting new standards for supporting innovation, new business creation and growth in its clusters through strategic partnerships between the public and the private sector.

The 4-day event is an inspiring platform for fast exchange of trends and ideas on innovation partnerships for clusters to enhance regional competitiveness.

300 cluster practitioners, consultants, policy makers and academics from 40 countries and institutions like UNIDO, World Bank and European Commission, among others, gather to advance the understanding of strategic innovation partnerships in clusters and to work towards practical solutions.

A mix of inspiring plenary presentations, cluster labs and tours, global coffee, makes up a highly interactive programme where over 140 speakers will contribute.
